A message from our board president...

Each year I am amazed at our continued growth and this year has been no exception. We've seen increases in our **donors**, our **investments**, and the **people** that are involved, but most importantly we've seen our ability to enhance the educational opportunities of students grow.

By the numbers...

22 - Years since the Foundation was formed by a group of people that loved the Fort LeBoeuf community and wanted to do their part to help students excel.

5 - Schools with students that Foundation serves. The Foundation strives to provide opportunities for students at all three elementary schools, the middle school, and the high school in the Fort LeBoeuf School District.

310,062: Total balance of assets in the Foundation (6/30/17). \$135,372 are unrestricted funds managed at the discretion of the Foundation while the remaining funds are designated for specific scholarships. The balance grew from \$264,659 at the beginning of the fiscal year from contributions and earnings for a net growth of \$45,404 all while still distributing \$31,149.

123: Donors who partnered with us to pursue our mission of enhancing the educational opportunities of students. (This doesn't include the guests at our Harvest Gala or individuals that gave directly to specific scholarship funds.)

6: Committees that meet to develop specific projects, programs, and events that propel the Foundation forward. Over 15 individuals participate in these committees and include our board, community members, teachers, and administrators.

7: Years that **Excellence in Education** grants have been provided. The Foundation has given over \$42,000 in funds to educators in the district to help promote innovative ideas, creative programs, and student opportunities through this program.

19: Graduating seniors who received 32 scholarships through the Foundation totaling over \$15,000 in 2017.

While our heritage has laid an incredible foundation, we push onward to the future as we plan to engage with our donors, expand our impact with additional funding and programs, and experience greater collaboration with our members and the community. Committee Updates

• **EITC**: After multiple attempts to have a program approved for participation in the Educational Improvement Tax Credit from the PA Department of Economic and Community Development, the Foundation worked with staff to develop "**STEAMing into the Future**," a comprehensive kindergarten through 5th grade robotics and coding program. This year the Foundation will reach out to local businesses that participate in the program to solicit funds and purchase the equipment for implementation. (*Chairman: Denny Fortin*)



• **Student Grants**: Over the years, the Foundation has budgeted several hundred dollars to help students with financial needs related to their education, such as summer school. The Foundation has expanded this part of the budget significantly as well as its scope to allow students to apply for mini-grants throughout the year for camps, programs, and seminars that will help enhance their educational opportunities. (*Chairman: Kathy Proctor*)

• **Finance**: We achieved one of our largest goals by having the Fort LeBoeuf Foundation's first ever budget approved by the board. As we head into 2018 and beyond, we look to use our annual budgeting process as a key strategic tool in helping grow the Fort LeBoeuf Foundation while sustaining the Foundation's' mission for generations of students to come. • **Donor Development**: We have retained a donor management software program that has enabled us to update our donor records and run financial reports with a few keystrokes. This will also give us a clearer picture of our constituents and their giving habits as we move forward this coming year. *(Chairman: Valerie Rose)*

• **Harvest Gala**: The 2016 Gala saw an increased attendance with 130 people and netted over \$7300 through ticket sales, sponsorships, and the silent auction. Through music, auctions and door prizes we encourage people to get involved. For 2017, we are striving to provide a memorable event again with the goal of seeing our attendance and funds raised increase 25%. (Chairman: Leigh Williams)

• Marketing: In 2017 we saw an expanded annual appeal delivered to the community coinciding with the Erie Gives Campaign. We have begun exploring opportunities with our efforts in social media, public relationships, and for an expanded 2018 campaign. (Chairman: Dr. Jason

Excellence in Education Grants

For the seventh year in a row The Fort LeBoeuf Foundation awarded several grants to teachers in all levels of the district from elementary to high school totaling over \$6000.

- At Robison Elementary, students who have Mrs. Woomer will get to experiment with Snap Circuits to learn about different forms of energy.
- Waterford Elementary was given funds to help produce the **school musical**. The play, directed by Mrs. Zylak, includes many students in all grade levels K-5.
- Also at Waterford, students will have access to more technology in Ms. Kulic's classes with tablets to host programs to support students struggling in reading and math.
- Mrs. Bukoski was given five Makeblock Robotics kits for second graders at Waterford; they will assemble and wire robotic tanks that are run by remote control.
- At the middle school level, Mrs. Friedman, who teaches 6th grade language arts, was given microphones that will allow students to record podcasts with the Chromebooks in research assignments.
- At the high school, the Foundation once more contributed to **Business Week,** a week long program that helps students learn how the economy works and discover their individual skills in various careers.
- Ms. Jennifer Peters was given Adobe Creative Cloud to use not only with art students, but also those who work on the yearbook and newspaper staff.
